## SWISS EXPO 2020 – Official Provisions on Animal Health (Subject to revision in the event of a health alert)

Animals to be presented at Expo 2020 are prohibited from being transported together with animals destined for another place or for another purpose. Cross-border transports are subject to all the provisions of European Council Regulation (EC) No. 1/2005.

Animals in the late stages of pregnancy, i.e. two months prior to delivery, are not eligible for Expo 2020.
